

Management of animal diseases: development of European legislation for the safety and traceability of meat, and the role of the veterinarian in the prevention and control of risk

Description

This course deals with multiple aspects related to managing animal diseases: from animal health law application to animal data-base capacity building in different species, and related follow up. The principles of animal health in the context of the institutional official control and the context of common diseases (infections, contaminations and parasitology) in different geographical areas will also be illustrated. Further topics will include: biosafety principles applied and linked to different geographical areas; food safety aspects for raw material and final production in the global trade market; capacity building of veterinary services (private and public); links in different international organizations (OIE, FAO, EFSA, WHO, WTO).

Program

- **Monday:** Risk assessment and risk management of the food chain production (from farm to fork). Main topics:
 - Risk assessment: Risk assessment criteria and principles; EU regulations and laws; EU and national systems; European Food Safety Authority and its functioning system, goals and communication
 - Risk management: Risk management criteria and principles; EU and national systems; central and local authorities in charge; assessment, management, monitoring and collection data requirements
- **Tuesday:** Biosecurity principles and animal health law follow-up; clinical signs of animal health management. Part 1
- **Wednesday:** Visit to EXPO Milano 2015
- **Thursday:** Biosecurity principles and animal health law follow-up; clinical signs of animal health management. Part 2
- **Friday:** Biosecurity principles and animal health law follow-up; clinical signs of animal health management. Part 3
Safe production of foods of animal origin. Main topics:
 - Risk assessment follow-up in the food production chain
 - Risk management criteria to manage food chain processes
 - Import/export criteria, certifications, management and inspection
